## **SCRIPT OF THANKS:** October 19, 2024 Longevity Bench Walk Celebration, Masconomo Park 10am.

Good morning, I welcome you all here this morning to celebrate the culmination of the Bench Walk Challenge, sponsored by the Longevity Bench Project this summer.

I am Lisa Bonneville, President of the LBP and I am very humbled by the support our Bench Project has received in six years since it was launched in 2018. Placing benches every half mile along 11 neighborhood loops was a goal that has attracted over 300 donors who have supported us with their dollars and others with their time – and the community with in-kind donations – and town committee and board members whose engagement and approvals have brought us to this day – brought us to this celebration. Today, that includes the Laughing Gull Café, with thanks to Bruce and Dede Warren for generously contributing the warm coffee and the first two gifts to our Hall of Fame inductees.

We are often asked about the process involved in adding a bench to the network, from "yes, I'd like to donate a bench" to installation. Every step is supported by many hearts and many helpful hands. Today, we want to thank those individuals and express our appreciation. On a Saturday, many are not able to be here but we will call their names just the same – and deliver their Certificate of Appreciation in person.

In May, we hosted a Donor Party and thanked our bench donors and Project sponsors. <u>Today we</u> <u>celebrate the production team.</u>

## Each bench:

- a. begins with a donor(s) and each has a unique story of tribute, caring for others, desire to contribute to this network of benches for the benefit of the whole town
- b. needs a site so approvals for each site are gathered from the <u>property owner, private or</u> town land; the <u>DPW</u> (including <u>Director, Chuck Dam</u>, Engineer, Nate Desrosiers and roads "guru", Sean who knows where every snow bank will be plowed; and Jeffreys Creek Land Contractors, <u>John Filias</u> Owner; the town Conservation Commission, chaired by Steve Gang whose inspection team will visit the site to confirm compliance on distance from wetland; and Greg Federspiel, Town Manager, for shepherding our presentations for final approvals to the 5-member Select Board, ably chaired now by Ann Harrison but involving all selected persons since 2018.
- c. has a plaque and text for each bench is determined by the donor and property owner.
  The first line is always: A Longevity Bench
  The second line is: A Place to Rest While Taking a Walk
- d. is ordered from our sponsoring vendor and manufactured to meet our uniquely designed ADA specifications.
- e. spends about 4 months in production, is crated and shipped
- f. within the month before the bench is due to ship, the concrete pad is laid and all is prepared for installation.
- g. in some cases, we have had the honor of celebrating bench "openings" with the donors, even the blessing of benches by a local priest.
- h. has received excellent visibility in the local media; the Manchester Cricket, the Gloucester Daily Times, the TIDE, the COA monthly newsletters and numerous Facebook friends, in addition to our own website, longevitybenchproject.org
- i. brought together this wonderful team, for which we have been very blessed.
